

TOUCHFREEZE

Have you ever been diligently typing on your laptop and your hand accidentally touches the touchpad and moves your cursor to a different location? You all of a sudden look up and your last two lines of text typed are inserted into the middle of a line at the top of your page! Here's the answer! A Google Code called TouchFreeze will automatically disable your touchpad while you are typing text. It's easy to install and even easier to use because you don't have to do anything! Problem solved.

Go to code.google.com/p/touchfreeze. Click downloads section and you will see a TouchFreeze file being downloaded. Click on that file and you will see a Security warning. It's safe so click Run. You will see a Welcome to TouchFreeze installation screen. Click Next. You will next be prompted on whether you want this installed for all users on this computer or just the current user. Select whichever is appropriate and click Next. Click Install. It will very quickly install. If you are feeling super generous today, you can click Donate to send a few bucks to the nice people who developed this, but it is not necessary. Click Finish.

It's that easy. Go into any document and just try to move your cursor while you are pounding on the keyboard. It won't let you! As soon as you start typing, the touchpad is active again.
